

ORDINANCE NO. 2009-49

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN MARCOS, TEXAS, AMENDING SECTION 8 OF ORDINANCE NO. 2009-46 ORDERING A GENERAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 3, 2009 FOR THE PURPOSE OF ELECTING A CITY COUNCIL MEMBER, PLACE 5, AND A CITY COUNCIL MEMBER, PLACE 6 BY SETTING THE HOURS OF 7:00 A.M. TO 7:00 P.M. FOR EARLY VOTING BY PERSONAL APPEARANCE ON MONDAY OCTOBER 19, 2009 AND ON MONDAY OCTOBER 26, 2009 AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN MARCOS, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That Section 8 of Ordinance No. 2009-46 is hereby amended to read as follows (added text is underlined)


“SECTION 8. The main early polling place for early voting by personal appearance for the election is the Hays County Election Administrator’s Office, 401-C Broadway. Early voting by personal appearance shall be conducted during normal working days Monday- Friday (excluding holidays) in the Hays County Election Administrator’s Office from October 19, 2009 through October 30, 2009 from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., except for Monday, October 19, 2009 and Monday, October 26, 2009 which shall be from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. and on October 24, 2009 (Saturday) from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. In addition, temporary branch and mobile early polling places for early voting by personal appearance for the City election are established at the following locations, with voting to be conducted at the dates and times indicated:

Texas State University-San Marcos LBJ Student Center 700 Student Center Drive San Marcos, Texas”	October 21, 2009 October 22, 2009	10:00a.m. to 7:00p.m. 10:00a.m. to 7:00p.m.

SECTION 2. If any portion of this Ordinance is held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions of this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 3. The importance of this Ordinance creates an emergency and an imperative public necessity, and the provisions of the Charter requiring that ordinances be presented at three separate meetings, and that ordinances do not take effect until ten days after the date of its final passage are suspended, and this Ordinance will take effect upon publication of notice of its adoption in a newspaper of general circulation within the City.
