8 **WQPP (Water Quality Protection Plan)**

10 Laurie Moyer gave a presentation on the Habitat Conservation Water Quality Protection
11 Plan (WQPP). The WQPP focuses specifically on environmental areas, code
12 recommendations, projects, and city implemental programs. Code SMTX provides an
13 opportunity to bridge the Vision San Marcos Comprehensive Plan and the WQPP.

15 **Transportation Master Plan**

17 Jennifer Shell gave a presentation on the current status of the Transportation Master Plan
18 and the focus on multimodal transportation and complete streets. Coordination with Code
19 SMTX takes complete streets cross sections and finalizes intent based on surrounding uses.
20 The projected completion date is Spring or Summer of 2015.

24 The Consultants gave an overview of Code Rodeo scoping, scale of project, and objective. The
25 Consultants lead a hands on activity with the Think Tank.
